VetCEE Membership Proposal for National Competent Authorities

Veterinary Continuing Education in Europe (VetCEE) is an international non-profit organization that provides accreditation of national and international veterinary Continuing Education (CE) programmes in Europe, and beyond.

VetCEE and the Role of the National Competent Authorities

Recognition of VetCEE accreditation by Veterinary National Competent Authorities (NCAs) provides increased CE opportunities for European veterinarians and facilitates the development of flexible career pathways across borders. VetCEE works in close collaboration with NCAs in different countries for recognition of competencies and credits accumulated by veterinarians through VetCEE accredited CE. Of course, awarding titles, registration of veterinarians and recording of their CE remains under the responsibility of the NCAs.

In order to give NCAs a voice in the future of continuing education across Europe, we are proposing countries that recognise VetCEE credits the opportunity to become a member.

Membership benefits include:

- Attendance of one (online) General Assembly per year
- The right to propose topics for discussion or voting at the General Assembly
- The right to vote at the General Assembly (NCAs that are also providers of veterinary CE must complete a conflict of interest statement to be allowed to vote)
- The right to propose Officers for VetCEE (President, Treasurer, etc.)

Membership commitments:

- Identify one official point of contact / representative
- Commitment to attend the General Assembly

Other membership formulas include: founding members, associate members and observer status for CE providers. The process for becoming a member will be launched in the second half of 2024 and will be official from 2025. There is no membership fee.
