VetCEE and the Role of Veterinary Associations

Associations that represent the interests of their members have an important role to play in changing the landscape of veterinary post-graduate education in Europe. It is in everybody's best interest that CE Providers are held to high standards, both for content and educational approach of their programmes and that credits are transferable between countries. This will give veterinarians access to high quality education across Europe to develop their knowledge and skills and contribute to their career pathways. Involvement of veterinary associations in VetCEE empowers them to advocate for the needs of their members.

In order to give veterinary associations a voice in the future of continuing education across Europe, we are proposing veterinary associations that recognise VetCEE credits the opportunity to become associate members.

Associate membership benefits include:

- Attendance of one (online) General Assembly per year
- The right to propose topics for discussion at the General Assembly

Associate membership commitments:

- Identification of one official point of contact / representative
- Commitment to attend the General Assembly

Other membership formulas include: founding members, national competent authority membership and observer status for CE providers. The process for becoming a member will be launched in the second half of 2024 and will be official from 2025. There is no membership fee.
